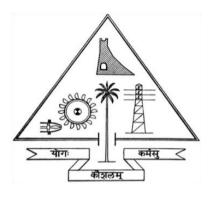

3. Non-GATE Assistantship to M. Tech Student

She was late to submit the application before the previous BoG, in which the sanction to 44 first year M.Tech students was taken. She was waiting for the sanction of MCM Scholarship. But her application was rejected and she is not availing any other scholarship. Now she had requested to grant Non GATE Scholarship from TEQIP fund. Approval from BoG sought in this matter.
